Located in the lower level of St. Paul's Cathedral, the Columbarium is a permanent part of the church structure and serves as sanctuary of cremated remains. The indoor facility provides year-round safety that is carefully monitored by church staff.

Cremated remains receive safe, proper and respectful care in St. Paul's Columbarium. The same congregational and community support which has preserved St. Paul's Cathedral as an important spiritual part of Regina ensures on-going care. St. Paul's Vestry and Columbarium Board of Management are strongly committed to this unique service.





What is a Columbarium?

A columbarium is a reverential place for the repose of cremated remains. It is a serene space available for visitation where one can quietly rekindle memories of loved ones.

Why St. Paul's Cathedral Columbarium?


St. Paul's Cathedral
Columbarium, accessible by
elevator, offers a quiet, tranquil,
secure and beautiful place. It is
valued for its sacred ambiance
and the peace it provides to
those who visit it. The lighting
is subdued encouraging calm
reflection.

Urns holding the ashes of loved ones are placed in Niches that are grouped together in a configuration called a vault. The oak vaults have glass backs and panels that allow light to reflect off the stone walls into each Niche. Niches are of different sizes to accommodate individuals, couples or family members. Nameplates are provided. Flowers may be placed in a bud vase designed to hang at the side of the Niche.

At St. Paul's Cathedral, the Niches are purchased with a one-time fee including opening/closing and maintenance. The Columbarium is cared for by Cathedral staff and volunteers. It is a resting place in perpetuity.

A unique aspect of St. Paul's Columbarium is the Memorial Book displayed prominently for visitors to see. The information given by family members is meant to be a snapshot of the loved one and memories about him or her.





The Columbarium is available to everyone regardless of church or religious affiliation. An added benefit for families and friends is a Requiem Eucharist held on the first Saturday of the month at 10:00 am. Everyone is welcome.

The Columbarium is valued for its sacred ambiance and the peace it provides to those who visit it.
